News from Year 3

Wow this half term has flown by! It was amazing to welcome back the children who were learning at home and we would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the parents and carers for supporting their children during the lockdown period. We would also like to thank the children who were learning in school for being superb role models for the children returning to school. This half term Stig of the Dump has thrown year 3 back to the Stone Age and the children have really enjoyed using Barney and Stig's adventures to support their descriptive work in English. In maths we have developed our measuring skills, looking at length and we are now moving onto fractions. Our history learning took us into the Iron Age of British History and we have paid specific attention to the chronological order of key events in Prehistoric Britain. Science has seen us begin to develop our understanding of how our body works looking at the skeleton and muscles as well as looking at what a well-balanced diet consists of. This half term we celebrated World Book Day for a whole month and have had some awesome fun creating clay sculptures and building miniature dens. Have a fantastic Easter Holiday and we look forward to seeing you in the summer term.



News from Year 4

Splish, splash, splosh! Year 4 have been looking at all sorts of liquids and solids, classifying them, identifying them and testing their properties. Our favourite lessons have been these science lessons where we have investigated the melting points of chocolate through a fair test. We will continue to look at states of matter in the summer term through the water cycles which we began to look at in geography this term through our rivers topic. Jo from Bough Beech reservoir dialed in to talk to us about water conservation too.





We linked in our English writing to our history topic and have written some epic Viking tales to add to a collective Viking saga - we tried to learn these by heart first so ask us to see what we can remember!



Marvelous book month also saw us writing weather haikus and cinquains poems, painting chalk art raindrops and Viking goblin book munchers!

News from Year 5

Year 5 have been busy working on producing 'The Easter Reflection' where we have been bringing the events leading up to Jesus' death. The children have learned and sung hymns, added sound effects, readings and characterisation and we have recorded these elements to bring the story to life. This has been challenging as there has been a quick turnaround since we have been back together in person for a few weeks, but nonetheless has been rewarding.

We have linked our science learning of 'Living things and their habitats' where we wrote biographies on naturalists, where we had to research, plan, write and edit our writing. In addition, we took the opportunity to write from an animal's perspective and used characterisation to bring their character to life whilst including facts about them to make our character realistic.

Marvelous book month in March has allowed us to be creative by finding 'lost words' in nature and leaf print into clay. We also created book marks to use when we are reading for pleasure.

We have enjoyed being all back together over the last few weeks. Happy Easter everyone!

News from Year 6




What is evolution? This is a question our Year 6 pupils can now answer, as throughout this half term we have been exploring evolution and inheritance in our Science learning. The

children have found out if they are trait a or b, through a series of small tests, such as can you roll your tongue?

Or what arm is on top when you fold your arms? In addition to discovering how different species adapt to the environment around them (we used tweezers and pretended we were finches!). We even went as far as designing an organism to live in a given environment and identify what adaptations it had developed to live there!



Science isn't the only subject we have dived deeply into. In art we have been learning how to draw figures in motion. We started by observing each other moving, so we could understand the mechanics of drawing in motion, before using ovals to support us to draw all of the limbs. Our final pieces have a link to Philip Pullman's "Clockwork" which was our focus text during the term.



During our RE learning, we have revisited the events of Good Friday and considered who bears the most responsibility for the events that led to Christ's death. It was a lively debate in all 3 classes, which culminated in all the children creating a "pie chart of responsibility". The children all thought carefully about their reasoning and justification making links from the Bible stories we know so well.

Marvellous book month has seen lots of creative and exciting "book" talk. We created bookmarks that were based on "Clockwork", (who knew would make excellent cog shapes!) As a class text we have been reading "The Danger Gang" written by Tom



Fletcher, which we have all found laugh-out-loud funny at times. Based on this we made finger puppets of the different members of "The Danger Gang".

The last 3 weeks have flown by, it has been a real pleasure to have the year group back together again. We look forward to our final term's adventures.
